

Our GCSE French students had an amazing trip exploring Paris. Magnifique!

On Friday 10th February after an overnight coach journey from Airedale Academy, the first stop on our itinerary was a trip on the Bateaux Mouches. Here students were able to spot some of the famous Parisian landmarks from the boat, while taking in the iconic buildings and architecture of the Notre Dame cathedral and the Musée d'Orsay.

Saturday 11th February started with a visit to the Place du Trocadéro, where we saw amazing views of the Eiffel Tower. This was followed by a walk along the river Seine, a visit to see the Mona Lisa and other masterpieces in The Louvre. The final stop, before our evening meal, was the Arc de Triomphe.

We spent the morning of Sunday 12th February at the Invalides, where we saw the tomb of the French Emperor Napoleon Bonaparte. We also visited an exhibit in the Musée de l'armée (Army Museum), where our students learned some of the personal stories of soldiers and civilians during the Second World War. Afterwards, we headed across Paris to the area of Montmartre. Here our students saw the Sacré-Coeur Basilica and explored the souvenir shops in the Place du Tertre. After enjoying a crêpe in a café, we walked through Montmartre to reach the Moulin Rouge.

On Monday 13th February we returned to Airedale Academy with a group of students who embodied our academy values of Respect, Ambition and Bravery from start to finish. They were a credit to our school, their parents and themselves.

Year 5 Referee Visit

Year 5 were visited by Mark Dwyer, an assistant referee for PGMOL (Professional Game Match Officials. He is a top-level match official who has refereed in over 200 championship football games including games where the likes of Rooney, Maguire, Sterling and Pickford were on the pitch. The children learnt all about the important role of match officials and the kit that is used as part of their job. Mark also taught the importance of working well as a team, communicating effectively and being able to perform well under pressure. The children then had an opportunity to apply their STEM knowledge and skills to help design a new or improved piece of kit before presenting to their class. A great morning was had by all. The pupils ended the session by reflecting on the PGMOL values: integrity, community, courage, learn and grow, accountability and innovation and how they would apply these values themselves.















Over the last 18 months, Jacob has been applying his creative writing skills to create a series of comics. We asked Jacob- why have you decided to make comics? Jacob told us that he finds it great fun as he enjoys being able to express his imagination through the illustrations and character developments. Year 6- Darwin's Theory of Evolution

Year 6 worked scientifically to prove Darwin's Theory of Evolution by investigating which beak is best for which food type. They used tweezers, scissors, pegs and spoons for "beaks" and pasta, rice, elastic bands and raisins to represent food. This helped them understand how the Galapagos Finches adapted over time and evolved, through natural selection.











Nursery - Living Eggs

Nursery were very excited to welcome ten eggs into Nursery this half term. They all watched very carefully to see when they would hatch. The pupils in nursery spoken about a chicken's lifecycle and what to expect from them hatching. On the third day, the pupils came into Nursery to find 3 hatched chicks! They saw the cracked egg shells and three chicks in the incubator. The same morning the children were able to see one chick actually hatch and another one hatched during lunchtime! There were 5 chicks in total with 3 more eggs with cracks in! By Friday morning all the chicks had hatched and the children were given the opportunity to hold the chicks.



READ TO SUCCEED: IN IT TO WIN IT

To encourage our pupils to read at home regularly, we have introduced a new whole school reading initiative 'Read to Succeed: In it to win it'. Within each class, an interactive reading chart helps to track pupils reading at home throughout the week. We are ambitious in our drive to encourage pupils to read at home to their parents daily, however appreciate this isn't always possible in the busy world we live in. Therefore, the aim is for every child to read their school reading book at home to an adult at an opportunity that they can. Each time a child reads at home, they will receive a raffle ticket to be placed into class box. Additionally, every time a child reads at school they will also receive a raffle ticket to add into the class box. This means at least every child will get at least one ticket throughout the school week. Parents are to sign and date within their child's home reading record, when they have heard their child read. The tickets that children acquire through reading at both home and school, will be put into a prize draw, which will be drawn every half term. The child drawn will win a book to keep for themselves. They will choose this from a selection of books kept in the classroom book prize box. This will help further promote our school ethos of reading for pleasure.

In addition to this, each week within key stage phases the class who has read the most receive the trophy for that week to display in their classroom. Teachers will keep a tally of how many tickets they distribute each week. The tally will then be counted at the end of each term and the class who won the trophy for the most reading will win an extra reading for pleasure session in the school library or at the local Airedale Library. Again, this will help to promote our reading for pleasure ethos and culture.


